On February 9, 2011, the police were called to the children's home due to a dispute between Mom and one of Michael's older siblings. The police observed Mom to be acting in a bizarre manner, and speaking of "black magic" and aliens coming into her home. The police advised Mom to seek mental health treatment but she refused. DSS tried to make contact with Mom but she refused to open the door when the worker made a home visit.

On March 14, 2011, Mom sent an email to the children's school principal that spoke of aliens and dogs coming into her home, and telling her children to avoid white people because they had sex with aliens. She also has a problem with people who have green eyes. The DSS worker met with Michael and his siblings at their schools. The children explained that Mom would not let them turn the light on in the bathroom because the aliens would come. Instead, she would make them go to the bathroom with a candle. The children have expressed that they were afraid of their Mom because of her strange behavior.

On March 18, 2011, the DSS worker met with Mom and recommended that Mom seek mental health treatment, but Mom again refused. At the Shelter Care Hearing, Mom expressed that she did not need medication or treatment. She stated that she had been previously given medication for

depression, but did not continuously take them. She agreed to take a substance abuse assessment but would not agree to therapy or medication of any kind.
